## Vocabulary Worksheet Side by Side Book One – Chapter 13

The words below are taken from Side by Side, Book One, Chapter 13. For each word below please write in what the word means and then a sentence using the word.

Actor: a person who acts in a play, movie, etc. Note: this is a general name for all, male

or female, who act.

Sentence: They went to drama school to be come actors.

**Actress**: a female who acts a part in a play or movie.

Sentence: Who is your favorite actress?

Apologize: to express regret for doing or saying something wrong: to give or make an

apology.

Sentence: You need to apologize to our neighbor for breaking their window.

**Application Form**: a standard form or procedure used to make requests or petitions. *Sentence*: Please fill out the admissions application form and send it back to the school.

**Apply For**: to make a formal application or request.

Sentence: You need to apply to the local consulate for a visa before visiting.

**Bake**: to cook (food) in an oven using dry heat. Sentence: We like to bake cookies after school.

**Baker**: someone who bakes, usually as their job.

Sentence: Mom goes to see the baker every morning to get fresh bread.

**Baseball**: a game played on a large field by two teams of nine players who try to score runs by hitting a small ball with a bat and then running to each of the four bases without being put out.

Sentence: The game of baseball lis very popular in the Americas, Japan, and Korea.

**Bowling**: a game played by rolling a large, heavy ball down a smooth floor (called a lane) towards a set of pins in order to knock down as many pins as possible.

Sentence: Our friends will all go bowling tonight after work.

**Build**: 1 to make something by putting together parts or materials. 2 to develop or form something gradually.

*Sentence*: He is building a new website.

**Building Superintendent**: **1** a person who directs or manages a building. **2** a person who is in charge of cleaning, maintaining, and repairing a building.

Sentence: Please ask the building superintendent when the walls will be fixed.

**Cash Register**: a machine used in a store, restaurant, etc., that calculates the amount of money due for a sale and has a drawer for holding money.

*Sentence*: The cash register is at the front of the store.



**Chef**: **1** a professional cook who usually is in charge of a kitchen in a restaurant. **2** a person who prepares food for people to eat.

Sentence: Mark is the head chef at a five-star restaurant.

**Cook**: (n) someone who prepares and cooks food for eating. (v) To prepare food for eating especially by using heat.

Sentence: My wife is a good cook

**Construction Worker**: a worker who builds buildings, roads, bridges and other structures.

Sentence: There is a high demand for construction workers in the new suburb.

**Crowded**: a large number of people or things especially when collected together.

Sentence: The roads are very crowded during rush hour.

**Customer**: someone who buys goods or services from a business.

*Sentence*: The store greatly values its regular customers.

**Dancer**: someone who moves their body in a way that goes with the rhythm and style of music that is being played.

Sentence: Carol is a much better dancer than Bob.

**Depressed**: 1 feeling sad 2 having a serious medical condition that causes a person to feel very sad, hopeless, and unimportant: suffering from mental depression. 3 having little economic activity and few jobs: suffering from economic depression.

*Sentence*: She was very depressed after loosing her job.

**Duplicate**: exactly the same as something else: made as an exact copy of something

Sentence: A duplicate license is issued to replace a valid license which has been lost.

**Equipment**: supplies or tools needed for a special purpose. *Sentence*: They needed special equipment for the new job.

**Eye Examination**: a series of tests designed to check vision and for eye diseases.

Sentence: After the eye examination Joyce found that she needed glasses.

**Homework**: **1** work that a student is given to do at home. **2** research or reading done in order to prepare for something.

Sentence: Their math teacher always gives them too much homework.

**In Person**: in one's presence.

Sentence: You need to apply for your new passport in person.

**Job**: **1** a paid position of regular employment. **2** a task or piece of work, especially one that is paid.

Sentence: He has a new job driving a taxi.

**Loan**: an amount of money that is given to someone for a period of time with a promise that it will be paid back: an amount of money that is borrowed.

Sentence: He took out a loan from the bank to pay for the car.



**Marriage License**: a document issued, either by a church or state authority, authorizing a couple to marry.

Sentence: You need to get a marriage license before getting married.

**Mechanic**: a person who repairs machines, such as car engines, and keeps them running properly.

Sentence: Our car is not running well so we should take it to a mechanic to be checked.

**Paint**: 1 to draw pictures or images on a canvas, board, etc. with paint. 2 to put paint (color) on houses, walls, etc.

Sentence: Painting is a very relaxing activity.

**Party**: a social event in which entertainment, food, and drinks are provided.

*Sentence*: We all had a lot of fun at the Christmas party.

**Passport**: an official document (travel document) issued by the government of a country that identifies someone as a citizen of that country and that is usually necessary when entering or leaving a country.

Sentence: You need a passport before you can travel to other countries.

**Photograph**: a picture made by a camera.

Sentence: Did you see Jane's photograph in the newspaper today?

**Reception Room**: a room in a hotel or other building used for functions such as parties and meetings.

Sentence: The house has two reception rooms - a living room and a dining room.

**Repair**: to fix: restore by replacing a part or putting together what is torn or broken. *Sentence*: His mother repaired is torn shirt.

**Road Test**: 1 a test to see how well a vehicle works when it is driven on roads. 2 a test to see how well someone is able to drive a car or other vehicle.

Sentence: I have to take a road test before I can get my driving license.

**Salesperson**: a person whose job is to sell things.

Sentence: The salesperson is told us we would get at 50% discount on the new car.

**Secretary**: a person whose job is to handle records, letters, etc., for another person in an office. an office assistant.

Sentence: He needs a secretary to help with all his administrative work.

**Singer**: someone who uses their voice to make musical sounds in the form of a song or tune.

Sentence: He's just a singer in a rock and roll band.

**Skate**: a metal frame that can be fitted to the sole of a shoe and to which is attached a runner or a set of wheels for gliding over ice or a surface other than ice.

*Sentence*: Ice hockey players are very good at ice skating.

**Ski**: 1 one of a pair of long narrow pieces of wood, metal, or plastic that curve upward slightly in front, are attached to shoes, and are used for gliding over snow. 2 to move or glide on skis over snow or water.

Sentence: My brother is a very good skier.



**Submit**: 1 to give (a document, proposal, piece of writing, etc.) to someone so that it can be considered or approved. 2 to stop trying to fight or resist something: to agree to do or accept something that you have been resisting or opposing. 3 to offer something as an opinion or suggestion.

Sentence: He submitted his application forms to the universities last week.

**Superintendent**: 1 a person who directs or manages a place, department, organization, etc. 2 a person who is charge of cleaning, maintaining, and repairing a building. Sentence: He is the construction superintendent for the new bridge project.

**Take Inventory**: to make a complete list (count and description) of the things, supplies of goods, etc. that are in a place.

Sentence: Can you please take inventory of the supplies in the back room?

**Teach**: 1 to cause or help someone to learn about a subject by giving lessons. 2 to give lessons about a particular subject to a person or group.

Sentence: Can you teach me how to use this cellphone?

**Teacher**: a person or thing that teaches something; especially: a person whose job is to teach students about certain subjects.

Sentence: She wants to be a teacher and teach young children.

**To Pay**: go give (usually money) in return for goods or services received.

Sentence: We need to pay the electric bill this month.

**Tools**: 1 handheld devices that aid in accomplishing a task. 2 something used in performing an operation or necessary in the practice of a vocation or profession (a scholar's books are his tools).

Sentence: The tools we need to build the bookcase are a hammer and screwdriver.

**Truck**: an automotive vehicle used for hauling goods.

Sentence: We need to hire a truck to move the equipment.

**Truck Driver**: someone whose job it is to drive a truck.

Sentence: Peter got a new job as a truck driver for the new supermarket.

**Trumpet**: a brass instrument that you blow into that has three buttons (valves) which you press to play different notes.

Sentence: A trumpet is a very loud musical instrument.

**Type**: to write with a computer keyboard or a typewriter.

*Sentence*: She can type 50 words per minute.

**Written Test**: a test requiring answers be given by writing.

Sentence: When you apply for your drivers license, you have to pass the written test before you can take the road test.
