Vocabulary Worksheet Side by Side Book One – Chapter 16

The words below are taken from Side by Side, Book One, Chapter 16. For each word below please write in what the word means and then a sentence using the word.

Ate Lunch: to have already eaten lunch. *Sentence*: We ate lunch three hours ago.

Bought Groceries: to have purchased food at the grocery store.

Sentence: Mom bought groceries at the store yesterday.

Day Off: a day when you are not required to work. *Sentence*: She has not had a day off for two weeks.

Did Exercises: to have exercised sometime in the past.

Sentence: She did her exercises last night.

Drove To The Supermarket: to have driven a car, truck, etc. to the supermarket.

Sentence: She drove to the supermarket this morning to buy vegetables.

Exercise: a physical activity that is done in order to become stronger and healthier.

Sentence: My doctor tells me I should exercise every day.

Forgot: the past tense of forget – to be unable to think of or remember something.

Sentence: I forgot how to play the piano.

Got Up: the past tense of get up – to arise from bed or to rise to one's feet.

Sentence: She got up to answer the phone.

Had Breakfast: to have already eaten breakfast. *Sentence*: We had breakfast at home this morning.

Last Night: yesterday (the day before today) night. *Sentence*: We went to see a nice movie last night.

Late: 1 existing or happening near the end of a period of time. 2 coming or happening after the usual, expected, or desired time. 3 doing something after the usual time or before others usually do.

Sentence: We will be 30 minutes late for our appointment this evening.

Made Dinner: to have already prepared dinner.

Sentence: I made dinner three hours ago and now it is cold.

Missed The Bus / Train / other: to be slow and not be on time to leave on a bus / train

or other.

Sentence: By not acting quickly he missed the opportunity to go out with his friends.

On Time: in good time, to/on schedule, when expected. *Sentence*: He was on time to meet his wife at the airport.



Read The Newspaper: to examine and grasp the meaning of (written or printed characters, words, or sentences) in a newspaper.

Sentence: Have you read yesterday's newspaper article about the local team?

Saw A Movie: to have watched a movie.

Sentence: Can we watch something else? I saw that movie three times already!

Stole: to have stolen (taken something that does not belong to you).

Sentence: The thief stole my watch.

Subway: **1** an underground electric railroad (metro). **2** a tunnel under a road for use by pedestrians.

Sentence: I take the subway to work to avoid the heavy traffic during rush hour.

Thief: a person who steals or takes things that do not belong to them.

Sentence: A thief took my purse.

This Morning: in the morning today.

Sentence: I stayed in bed to rest this morning.

This Afternoon: in the afternoon today.

Sentence: This afternoon we will go to see a movie.

This Evening: in the evening today.

Sentence: I have a date with my boyfriend this evening.

Tonight: on this night or on the night following this day.

Sentence: It will be very cold tonight.

Took A Shower: to have bathed in a shower.

Sentence: I already took a shower and am now ready for bed.

Usually: done, found, or used most of the time or in most cases: normal or regular.

Sentence: I usually check my email after breakfast in the morning.

Went To Sleep: to have already gone to sleep. *Sentence*: Pam went to sleep three hours ago.

Wrote A Letter: to have already written a letter.

Sentence: Dave wrote a letter to his grandmother last week.

Yesterday Morning: during the morning of the day before today.

Sentence: Yesterday morning we went to see a play.

Yesterday Afternoon: during the afternoon of the day before today.

Sentence: We had our English class yesterday afternoon.

Yesterday Evening: during the evening of the day before today. *Sentence*: Coco and Bill had their big date yesterday evening.
