Vocabulary Worksheet Side by Side Book One – Chapter 4

The words below are taken from Side by Side, Book One, Chapter 4. For each word below please write in what the word means and then a sentence using the word.

Brushing: using a brush, a device composed of bristles typically set into a handle and used especially for sweeping, smoothing, scrubbing, or painting.

Sentence: Mary is in the other room brushing her hair.

Busy: actively doing something, full of activity or work.

Sentence: Are you busy this evening?

Cat: a small animal related to lions and tigers that are often kept by people as a pet.

Sentence: We have five cats at home.

Cleaning: to free from dirt, marks, etc. tending to keep clean. Sentence: I cannot study right now as I am cleaning my bedroom.

Clothes: the things people wear to cover their bodies and are usually made from cloth.

Sentence: Connie enjoys going out to buy new clothes.

Dining Room: a room in which meals are eaten.

Sentence: Dinner will be served at 7pm in the dining room.

Feeding: to give food to someone or something.

Sentence: Coco is feeding the fish.

Fixing: the act or process of one that fixes: makes something whole or able to work

properly again. to repair something.

Sentence: The shop is fixing my broken cellphone.

Health Club: a private club where people go to exercise.

Sentence: I quit going to the health club as it was too much work.

Laundromat: a place with machines for washing and drying clothes, towels, sheets, etc.

Sentence: We use laundromats when we travel to wash our clothes.

Neighbors: people who live next to or near.

Sentence: Our neighbors are very quiet.

Painting: a picture made by putting paint on a canvas, board, etc. the activity of

painting houses, walls, etc.

Sentence: We will be busy this weekend painting the bedroom walls.

Radio: a device that is used to receive the signals that are broadcast by radio (without

wires).

Sentence: I like to listen to latest music on the radio.



Reading: a book, article, etc., that is being read or that is intended to be read.

Sentence: My English class is reading "A Tale of Two Cities".

Washing: an act of washing (cleaning) something with water and soap.

Sentence: Bob and Carol are outside washing the dog.

Windows: openings in a wall, door, etc. that usually contain a sheet of glass.

Sentence: During the storm be sure to close all the windows.
