Side by Side Book One – Chapter 7

The words below are taken from Side by Side, Book One, Chapter 7. For each word below please write in what the word means and then a sentence using the word.

Across From: on the opposite side.

Sentence: Jack and Jill sit on opposite sides of the room from each other.

Air Conditioner: a machine used to control air temperature and humidity. usually used to cool a space.

Sentence: I cannot live in tropical climates without an air conditioner.

Airport: a place where aircraft land and take off and where there are buildings for passengers to wait in and for aircraft.

Sentence: Be sure to arrive at the airport three hours before your scheduled departure.

Around The Corner From: the other side of a point where two streets or roads meet.

Sentence: The post office is around the corner from the bakery.

Bakery: a place where bread, cakes, cookies, and other baked foods are made or sold.

Sentence: Can you please buy a cake at the local bakery on your way home?

Bank: a place for the saving, loaning, exchanging and managing money.

Sentence: My company deposits my salary directly into my bank each month.

Barber Shop: a place where men can get their hair cut.

Sentence: Your hair is getting very long – you should go to the barber shop soon.

Bathroom: a room with a sink and toilet and usually a bathtub or shower.

Sentence: It is my turn to clean the bathroom this week.

Between: the space or time that separates two things or people.

Sentence: The school is between the park and the shopping center.

Book Store: a store that sells books.

Sentence: Book stores are a very popular place in Shenzhen to meet.

Broken: not working properly. separated into parts or pieces by being hit, damaged, etc.

Sentence: My cellphone was broken after I dropped it on the ground.

Building: a structure such as a house, hospital, school, etc. with a roof and walls used as a place for people to live, work, do activities, store things, etc.

Sentence: The office will be in the new building downtown.

Bus Station: a place where buses (large vehicles used for carrying many passengers) start or end their route.

Sentence: You can choose between thirty buses at the downtown bus station.

Bus Stop: a place where a bus will stop to let passengers get on or off.

Sentence: There is a bus stop next to my home.

Cafeteria: a restaurant in which customers collect their meals on trays at a counter before sitting down to eat.

Sentence: Nobody likes the food served at the school cafeteria.

Children: young people usually younger than thirteen.

Sentence: There are many children at the primary school this year.

Clinic: a place where people get medical help (outpatient).

Sentence: Mary went to the clinic today to check up on her cold.

Closet: a usually small room that is used for storing things such as clothing, towels, dishes, etc).

Sentence: Each bedroom has its own closet.

Cockroach: a black or brown insect that is sometimes found in people's homes.

Sentence: It can be very difficult to get rid of cockroaches.

Convenient: allowing you to do something easily or without trouble. located in a place that is nearby and easy to get to.

Sentence: It is very convenient to shop on the Internet these days.

Day: a period of 24 hours beginning at midnight: one of the seven time periods that make up a week.

Sentence: The rent is due on the first day of the month.

Department Store: a large store that has separate areas in which different kinds of products are sold.

Sentence: Rainbow is a popular department store in Shenzhen.

Drug Store: a store or part of a store in which drugs and medicines are prepared and sold. also known as a pharmacy.

Sentence: Can you buy some aspirin at the drug store?

Elevator: a machine used for carrying people and things to different levels in a building. also known as a lift in British English.

Sentence: Does the building have an elevator?

Fire Escape: a stairway or ladder that can be used to escape from a burning building.

Sentence: Most older buildings have fire escapes.

Floors: all the rooms or areas on the same level of a building; a story.

Sentence: His office is on the twenty-second floor. The building has thirty floors.

Gas Station: a place where gasoline (petrol) for vehicles is sold. also known as a petrol station (British English).

Sentence: We need to find a gas station before we run out of fuel.

Hair Salon: a place that gives customers (usually women) beauty treatments (such as haircuts).

Sentence: Grace spends her Saturday afternoons at the hair salon.

Health Club: a private club where people go to exercise.

Sentence: I quit going to the health club as it was too much work.

Hole: an opening into or through something. a hollow place in the ground.

Sentence: The old building has many holes in the walls.

Hospital: an institution providing medical and surgical treatment and nursing care of ill or injured people.

Sentence: Bob had to go to the hospital today to treat his broken arm.

Hotel: a place that has rooms in which people can stay especially when they are traveling; a place that provides food, lodging, and other services for paying guests.

Sentence: When we went to London we stayed at a very nice hotel.

Inside: the inner part of something such as a building or machine.

Sentence: The children play inside on rainy days.

Jacuzzi: company trademark: used for a bathtub in which a pump causes water and air bubbles to move around your body.

Sentence: We like to sit in the Jacuzzi on nice summer nights.

Laundromat: a place with machines for washing and drying clothes, towels, sheets, etc.

Sentence: We use laundromats when we travel to wash our clothes.

Mailbox: a public box where letters and packages are placed to be collected and sent.

Sentence: The building has mailboxes next to the lobby.

Mice: small animals with a pointed nose and a long, thin tail.

Sentence: The mice ate all our rice.

Movie Theater: a building where movies are shown. also known as a cinema.

Sentence: We can watch the new movie at the movie theater downtown.

Next To: immediately following or adjacent (close) to.

Sentence: The carrots are next to the lettuce at the grocery store.

Night: the time of darkness between one day and the next: the part of the day when no light from the sun can be seen and most people and animals sleep.

Sentence: He works at night and sleeps during the day.

Outside: an area around or near something such as a building.

Sentence: We like to play outside on nice days.

Owner: the person or group that has something as property: who legally possess something.

Sentence: I am the owner of my computer.

Post Office: a building where the mail for a local area is sent and received. the government department in charge of collecting and delivering mail.

Sentence: She works at the post office.

Refrigerator: a device or room that is used to keep things (such as food and drinks) cold.

Sentence: Our refrigerator keeps our food fresh.

School: an institution that provides instruction and training.

Sentence: We go to school five days a week.

Shopping Mall: a large building or group of buildings containing many different stores.

Sentence: The teenagers like to meet at the local shopping mall.

Sidewalk: a concrete or brick path along the side of a street for people to walk on.

Sentence: Motorized vehicles are not allowed on sidewalks in most countries.

Stove: a flat piece of kitchen equipment for cooking which becomes very hot when turned on.

Sentence: I cooked the burgers on the stove.

Street: a road in a city or town that has houses or other buildings on one or both sides.

Sentence: Be careful when you cross the street.

Superintendent: a person who directs or manages a place, department, organization, etc.

Sentence: We asked the building superintendent to fix the broken windows.

Supermarket: a large self-service store selling foods, household goods, etc.

Sentence: Can you please buy new light bulbs when you go to the supermarket?

Train Station: a railway facility where trains regularly stop to load or unload passengers or freight.

Sentence: You can find trains to many other cities at the train station.

Video Store: a store where you can buy movies.

Sentence: Can you buy a copy of the Harry Potter movie at the video store today?

Washing Machine: a machine for washing clothes, bed linens, etc.

Sentence: We need to buy a new washing machine to clean our clothes.

Window: an opening in a wall, door, etc. that usually contains a sheet of glass.

Sentence: During the storm be sure to close the window.
